### INTERIOR DECORATOR SEES WORK AS ART

#### **K Interior Design Offers Affordable Decorating for the Contemporary Home**

“Interior decorating takes a certain eye, and you either have that eye or you don’t,” Faubion said. “I can walk into a room and visualize a design process.”

Faubion started her business three years ago and focuses on home staging, interior decorating and redesign. As a member of the Real Estate Staging Association and HSR Certified as a Professional Home Stager and Redesigner, Faubion has worked with notable builders such as Kyle Schueller of Schueller Homes, and her staging work has been highlighted in *Ventanas* magazine.

Faubion, married to husband Robert for 26 years, has always had a creative streak, majoring in fashion merchandising at University of Arizona in Tucson, where her two sons, Spencer and Roger, now attend, and she is a jewelry designer. That creative spark helps her, especially when she is helping her clients prepare their homes for the market.

“Home staging is extremely important because it helps market the property, setting you apart from others, and it raises the value of the home,” she said.

While staging, redesigning and decorating does raise the value of a home, it doesn’t have to be expensive.

“Basically people have everything they need, they just need to pull it together,” said Faubion, who can come in at any stage of the process, from simply providing a list of items a client will need or using her trade discount at showrooms and selecting items herself. “It is not as expensive as people think.
